The eighth TRANS³Net newsletter will be published shortly before Christmas.

On behalf of all nine TRANS³Net project partners, we would like to take this opportunity to thank all readers of the newsletter for the good cooperation in 2018. Thank you very much! The network has grown noticeably this year. The

map of transfer promoter already contains 77 entries. In total, we have reached around 300 transfer experts as well as interested scientists and entrepreneurs in overall eight TRANS³Net.events so far. The satisfaction rate was 84 percent on average.

These numbers should give us hope with a view to the next year. TRANS³Net turns onto the home stretch. In June 2019 we want to officially declare the start of the network at the closing event of the project in Ústí nad Labem. Until then there is still a lot to do, especially discussions with potential network partners are to lead. The additional offer of the <u>innovation portal</u> will be ready in early 2019 and present application-ready research results that are suitable for a transfer to the economy or a cooperative development.
